The Need

The Cherish Our Home, Grow Our Legacy Capital Campaign was developed following a parish feasibility study, survey, and townhall discussions. It addresses overdue maintenance of the church and school, along with the potential to build a new multipurpose facility to accommodate the growing need for parish and school meeting and gathering spaces.

Cherish our home.

To ensure functional and efficient spaces at St. John's—today and in the future—it's critical to maintain our existing facilities. During the summer of 2023, we replaced the roof over our church and school. We also updated the 40-year-old lighting system in the church because we could no longer buy replacement parts. Next, we must address delayed maintenance issues in the three 1958 school wings and replace the 20-year-old heating and air system in the church.

Grow our legacy.

In the summer of 2024, we'll begin electrical work and other preparations to update the school wings in the summer of 2025. Breaking ground for a new multipurpose facility may happen in 2026 or later. This new facility will increase social hall capacity, expand meeting room space for parish groups, potentially add an adoration chapel, and ensure all are closer to the church and existing parking.

Questions & Answers

Where would a new multipurpose facility be located? We've considered several locations across the campus. Based on site reviews and parish survey feedback, the proposed location is to the west and north of the church.

What will the new multipurpose facility look like? Our parish has engaged a local architect to help design the new facility once we've defined the parish's wants and needs for its uses and functions. An initial illustration can be found on page 8.

What are the major uses of our current social hall? During the day, it is used for funeral lunches, before/after school care, and for classroom space. In the evenings, it is used for OCIA classes, Knights of Columbus general and officer meetings, scout meetings, and many other parish meetings and events.

What will happen to the current social hall if a new multipurpose facility is built? We're considering options to remodel the social hall. If we created two junior high classrooms, we could then shift the use of space above the stage from a current classroom to before/after school care.

How will the gym be used if a new multipurpose facility is built? We'll continue to use the current gym for school PE classes, school lunchroom, and for evening/weekend sports team practices and games.

Will a new multipurpose facility be used for school lunches or recess? Physical education classes and recess would still take place in the current gym or outdoors. The parish is still considering the use and functions of a potential new building.

Has a study been done on how much the school will grow? The diocese has done studies for projected city growth and potential impact on the city's parishes. Unfortunately, we can't be certain how many of those potential future families would choose to attend our school.



The Decision to Give TO THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

ST. JOHN THE APOSTLE CHURCH Milestones

For nearly 65 years, dedicated parishioners have shared their time, talents, and treasure to build an extraordinary parish community at St. John's. The *Cherish Our Home, Grow Our Legacy* Capital Campaign builds upon this legacy.

1958	On Dec. 27, the Feast of St. John the Apostle, Bishop James V. Casey created St. John the Apostle parish on nine acres at 76th & Vine Streets and named Monsignor Maurice Helmann to serve the parish's 200 families.
1959	On July 12, the parish broke ground for the new church, social hall, and six classroom school.
1960	Bishop Casey dedicated St. John's Church on May 1, serving 800 families. In September, St. John's School opened its doors to 200 students.
1979	Father Joe Mroczkowski and assistant Father Lyle Johnson broke ground on a new church building on June 10.
1980	We celebrated the first Mass in the 'new' church on July 20. We completed the gym and additional classrooms to accommodate 300 students.
1985	We completed three more classrooms, a 175-seat social hall, a stage and balcony seating in the gym. Our parish now serves 1,000 families.
2000+	St. John's remodeled the church sanctuary, resurfaced the parking lot, and built church offices, meeting spaces, and a new rectory. In the school, upgrades included repair and renovation of windows, reconfiguring classrooms, heating and air system, kitchen, gym floor, roof, and lights.
2023	The Cherish Our Home, Grow Our Legacy Capital Campaign launches to serve the growing needs of our 1,345 parish families. Priorities include structural and mechanical updates of the church and school, a new

multipurpose facility, and a remodel of the current social hall.
